# What happens to any profit from the Show?

Among other factors, the weather is hugely influential! Some of the profits are ploughed back into the infrastructure of the Show as and when required (mainly the smaller marquees etc.). Thereafter, any profit is distributed among the various good causes, clubs and societies in Tysoe. Any organisation is welcome to apply. Donations are occasionally given to organisations which are 'outside' the village, but of benefit to residents. (The Committee looks favourably on applications from those whose representatives are able to assist with the physical work of setting-up the Show, helping on the day *and* assisting with packing away after the Show on Saturday afternoon. (This is usually achieved between about 4:30p.m. and 7:00 p.m.)

# Marmalade Cake

## Ingredients:

175g softened butter 175g caster Sugar

- 3 eggs, lightly beaten
- 120g coarse-cut marmalade
- 1 orange rind, finely grated
- 225g self-raising flour
- 1 teasp baking powder
- 60g ground almonds

To glaze: 2 or 3 tablespoons coarse-cut marmalade

Prep: 15min > Cook: 45mins

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180 C / Gas 4. Line the base & sides of a 2lb loaf tin, (23 x 13 x 7cm)
- 2. Beat together softened butter and caster sugar with an electric hand mixer until well combined.
- 3. Beat in eggs, the marmalade and orange zest.
- 4. Using a large spoon, fold in flour, baking powder and ground almonds until there is no sign of any dry ingredients.
- 5. Spoon the cake mixture into the loaf tin; bake for 40-45 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean.
- 6. Cool in the tin for 5 minutes. Gently warm 2 or 3 tablespoons of marmalade in a non-stick pan, then spoon over the top of the cake while it is till warm.
- 7. Remove the cake from the tin, and leave to cool completely on a wire rack.
