### MINUTES

**Present:** David Roache (Chair), Cllr. Graham Collier, Cllr John Tongue, Cllr Bev Cressman, Wayne Cressman, Jeremy Rivers Fletcher, Isobel Watson. (Apologies Alison Edwards). Nine members of the public were present.

1. DR welcomed the members of the public to the meeting
2. **Declaration of interests** by Steering Committee members. (None)
3. **New Terms of Reference.** These differ slightly from old TORs. Final signatures received from members of Steering Committee at meeting. TORs to be displayed on notice board and on-line. Parish Clerk to file signed document.
4. **Redrafting of Plan.** Comments on the redraft to date have been received by David from members of Steering Committee. We need to get as much of the new content (resulting from feedback and the new site evaluations) in as possible before final edit. Isobel and Wayne will ensure next Draft incorporates all editorial/proof reading comments and together read through/alter document to ensure it reads well.
5. **Progress on Feedback.** Responses to public feedback have been completed from the Steering Committee's side, awaiting Neil Pearce's more technical responses to some of the feedback comments. Printed form of feedback and responses to be made available in Tysoe tearoom and in Reading Room. Will be hundreds of pages. Also on-line. Before this can be made available all names and addresses are being redacted (Wayne, with help)
6. **Update on new site assessments.** Awaiting these from Neil P. Will be available before Christmas. These will be up to inspectors' standards.
7. **Meeting open to questions from public.** It was pointed out that Stratford District Council says that there is no target to be met for housing numbers. The Chair agreed that this is now the case but pointed out that the revised numbers in the next Draft simply continue Tysoe's slow and steady rate of growth over the past decades. A member of the public stated that inspectors more recently have taken the line that the so called 'indicative number' given by the District Council is a minimum, not a maximum. A request was made for more regular updates on the Steering Committee's activities. It was pointed out that questions can be asked at our public meetings and at the Parish Council meetings.
8. **Next meeting** 19<sup>th</sup> December at 7.15pm in the Village Hall.
