#### 18. PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN

Following so shortly after the Parish Assembly in February, Cllr Sinclair used the opportunity to give a report on the plans of the Parish Council for the year to come. Cllr Sinclair reported that:

- Tysoe Parish Council pledges to do its best to represent the wishes of residents in continuing to ensure that Tysoe remains valued as much for its secure and caring community, as it is for its surroundings and ambience.
- The village should expect some development and changes ahead but, hopefully, at a pace which residents consider acceptable and with a focus on affordable housing projects. The Council will work with Stratford District Council and planning enforcement to ensure that future housing developments adhere to their planning conditions and are held accountable if breached, in particular this will be important in maintaining road safety, pedestrian safety, where development work is ongoing and making good any damage to pavements, grass verges and hedgerows. Also that discharge of conditions are adhered to in full.
- The Council will support 'No Mow May', find ways to reduce the ongoing dog fouling problem, repair village greens which have been damaged by continuous parking on them. Add new cycle racks to encourage people not to use their cars. These will be located at the Village Hall thanks to Tysoe Village Hall Committee and at the Playing Field carpark.
- There will be progress to the upgrade of streetlights to LEDs.
- The Parish Council raised the precept for 2021 – 2022 to support projects already maintained, new projects and award grants.
- Monthly surgeries will recommence by early June in Tysoe Tea Rooms. This is a chance to meet councillors and the district councillor and discuss any issues you might have or would like to bring to the Parish Council's attention.
- The Council welcomed Matt Jervis-Cleaver as a new councillor.
- Encouraged feedback and ideas from residents new and old.
- The Parish Council meets at 7.15pm on the second Monday of the month.

In closing Cllr Sinclair extended personal thanks to fellow councillors for their hard work and support and to everyone in the community who takes an interest in the Council.
