Parish Council News – July 2019

Parish Council Meeting 8th July 2019

Tysoe Parish Council met at 7.15 on July 8^{th} at the village hall. All councillors were present with 8 members of the public. After the usual declaration of interests and confirmation of the minutes of the previous meeting, members of the public spoke about the tree at the top of the playing field, replacing the road signs at Lower Tysoe, and the recent spate of burglaries.

County councillor Williams reported on flooding, a rope swing and footpath signing and maintenance. He also explained progress on HS2. Financial matters of the parish were then discussed and agreed. We were given an update about the neighbourhood plan. Two planning applications were discussed, street lighting and mowing were agreed, and there was a discussion about building practices in relation to a new development in Tysoe. Stratford's Core strategy was discussed in relation to housing supply.

Trees were discussed and an action plan agreed. A local farm tenancy and the lease for the tennis courts was discussed, as was the purchase of more defibrillators for the village. It was agreed that the parish computer would be located in the Tea Rooms, and that more litter bins would be obtained.

Vulnerable residents were discussed as was an allowance for the chair of the council. Councillors reported on their particular areas of responsibility, and the meeting closed just after 10 pm. Well a bit of summer has been noticed over the last month and that has brought things on well at the orchard The soft fruit is delicious, as always, and although not as much as last year there is enough to go round! The blueberries have needed watering every couple of days as there has been a distinct lack of good rain, not complaining! Raspberries, red currants, white currants, black currants and gooseberries are all giving the members fresh, organic fruit!

The stone fruit pruning will be complete by the end of July and then it's on to some summer pruning of the largest apple and pear trees. This will not encourage more growth of these big trees but keep them at a manageable height and breadth. The July drop is necessary despite fears that there would be few apples and pears! Actually some of the early varieties have no fruit due to the frosts and winds but later varieties will have a good crop. Burt we do need some lengthy spells of rain, in between the sunshine, to help the fruit mature it a good size.

Mowing is always a major task and this year has been no exception. The mowing team have done a great job and even introduced an interesting chequer board approach by leaving patches of longer grass in between closer mown paths. This leaves more vegetation for wild life whilst maintaining hygiene under the trees. The main things is the dandelions have been kept under control!

TYSOE UTILITY ESTATE GRANTS AVAILABLE

The Utility Estate (or Trust) provides discretionary grants to qualifying individuals living within the parish of Tysoe.

Students embarking on a recognised course of further education, having completed compulsory education.

A Christmas grant, delivered in January, is given to pensioners as follows:-Ladies aged 62 and over. Gentlemen aged 65 and over. 3 years' residency.

A death grant towards funeral costs. 3 years' residency.

A discretionary grant may also be available to individuals suffering unexpected hardship.

GDPR prevents the trustees gaining access to individuals' details and we have to rely on our local knowledge. Whilst this is extensive, we cannot know about everyone who might qualify and, to this end, must rely on <u>you</u> to inform <u>us</u>.

Making space for nature in St Mary's Churchyard

The recent reports in the national news about the adverse effects of human activity on the natural environment have inspired a group of us to think about how we might make the churchyard a more friendly place for wildlife, and also engage local children and adults in this activity.

As a first step, we're planning to develop a small 'wildflower meadow' beside the pathway on the north side of the church. This has been marked out with wooden stakes. Our aim is to allow one half of the area to grow for the rest of the summer to see which flower species are already present. With the other half we plan to introduce a variety of wildflower seeds, firstly scraping away some of the grass to allow the seeds a better chance to germinate. Rather than obtain seeds from a commercial supplier we're hoping to transfer some fresh, seed-rich hay from the churchyard at Oldberrow near Henley in Arden. Oldberrow Churchyard is well-known for its wonderful display of wildflowers.

We will be following the development of the 'meadow' and recording what's there from time to time. We will also be taking steps to encourage birds, by constructing nest boxes for next spring, and will be holding an event next spring/ summer to find out more about bats. You are very welcome to come and look at the meadow and soon we will be providing more information about it in the church.


