

Police Report – November 2020 – February 2021.

TYSOE.

Introduction. Firstly I would like to take this opportunity to formally introduce myself as the current Beat Manager for Shipston which includes the village of Tysoe. I have been in post since December 2019 however due to COVID it has been difficult to get out and meet the community and interact in a way that I would've liked. I have arrived with 20 years of Policing experience all spent on the South Warwickshire area. I have worked within a number of Safer Neighbourhood Teams including Wellesbourne, Southam and Stratford Upon Avon as well as response and Local Investigations.

This last year has been a very strange one for everyone and Policing is no exception. The loss of the hospitality industry has been replaced with COVID reports and a few more neighbour disputes!! The team at present consists of a two PCSO's, myself and a volunteer. We have 53 villages and the town centre of Shipston which forms the makeup of the beat.

At present we are supported by the Rural Crime Team of which there are two allocated officers who assist and cover the areas of Shipston, Wellesbourne and Southam.

The following crime report covers the area of Tysoe for a period of three months:

Burglary Dwelling – 3 – There were three reported burglaries which were logged with Police between 9th December 2020 – 14th December 2020. One of the burglaries has been detected with the offender being charged to court.

Suspicious Incidents – 4 – Two of the incidents related to suspicious vehicles one with the smell of cannabis and the other selling / offering garden furniture. The vehicle offering the furniture was from another county and home Police force asked to attend and evaluate for COVID breach. Another incident reported as possible rogue traders – dropping leaflets off.

Burglary Business – 1 – There was one reported business burglary, two trailers were taken from inside a secure unit. One of the trailers was later recovered near Kineton.

In the absence of Community Forum Meetings it has been decided that the three area Priorities for the Shipston Beat will be:

- 1) Rural Crime – Patrols of outer lying villages to be increased where possible.
- 2) Speeding – Speed camera being utilised to gather hotspot information.
- 3) Drugs Intelligence building – disruption and education.
